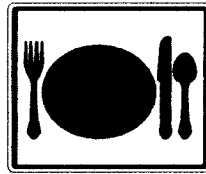

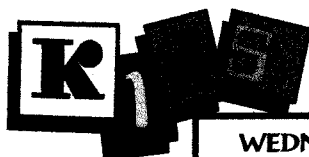
Ice Cream Social will be in the church Fellowship Hall following the concert.

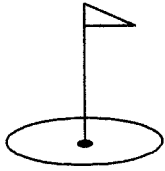
