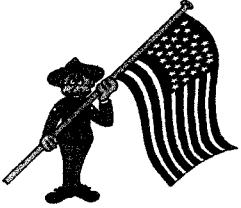

FLAG DAY - JUNE 14

**LET'S ALL FLY
OUR FLAGS
THIS DAY**

In the United States, Flag Day is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened that day by resolution of the Second Continental Congress in 1777.

In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress.

Flag Day is not an official federal holiday, though on June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first (and only) U.S. state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday.

The largest Flag Day parade is held annually in Troy, New York. Framingham, Massachusetts also holds a yearly Flag Day parade, as do many other towns and cities, although in recent years a shrinking turnout has prompted the town to consider eliminating the event.

*****NOTICE*****

All-terrain vehicles, go-karts and dirt bikes (hereafter referred to as "ATV(s)") must be registered at the LVL POA Office. Only ATV(s) owned by Property Owners of Linn Valley Lakes are allowed to be registered. ATV(s) that are owned by non-property owners are not allowed at Linn Valley Lakes.

No application for registration shall be accepted from any person or entity who is not a property owner of Linn Valley or a member in good standing of POA.

Applications for registration must be accompanied by (a) proof of ownership of the ATV(s), (b) proof of current liability insurance on the ATV(s), and (c) proof of residence or status of a member in good standing of the POA.

A copy of the City of Linn Valley Ordinance is available at City Hall or the POA Office.

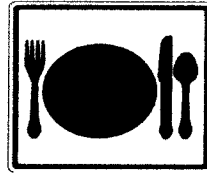


BRAIN TEASER

Volunteers are urgently needed to assist in delivering Meals on Wheels to Linn Valley residents.

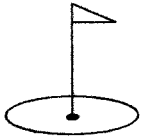

DEER TRACE GOLF COMMITTEE MEETING

MAY 5, 2008

Golf Course Superintendent, Dale Moles thanked everyone who helped with the aerification. The help is very much appreciated.

All holes are open for play now. Some fairways have been widened. Weeds are bad and will be sprayed next week - one application will probably be enough. Another helper will start work May 19th for the summer. Dale is trying out a new chemical on the greens and collars. The greens are mowed daily now. They will harvest from the chipping green for repair of greens. They are working on the drainage problem on No. 14 and will replace boards on the bridge on No. 7. Shrubs will be placed beside each tee marker.

Dale noted that Article IV, Section 5, Paragraph G. of the Golf Course Rules and Regulations will be strictly enforced:

G. Only golf carts, golf course maintenance equipment, and POA maintenance equipment are allowed on the Golf Course. No all-terrain or off-road vehicles are allowed. Golf carts must have regulation golf cart tires.

CO-ED REPORT: Drew stated that the Co-Ed's play at 6:00 pm each Wednesday. Cards will be played this Wednesday at the Main Clubhouse, because of the High School Tournament.

WGA REPORT: Augusta stated that the Invitational Tournament had a good turnout, and the Ladies play at 9:00 am and 6:00 pm Tuesdays.

MGA REPORT: The MGA would like more members. They have no tournaments scheduled yet but may have a match play with the Seniors. A Memorial for Jim Chambers will be discussed at our next meeting. The Men would like the other Associations to help with this.

SUPER SENIORS: Bob stated that the Super Seniors Members/Guest Tournament is scheduled for June 26.

FEES: A discussion was held regarding fees for Association Tournaments. A further discussion was held regarding Trail Fees, and the revised Rules and Regulations were read. Grandchildren are not included in the Annual Trail Fee. The rules for the Annual Trail Fee (which is for one cart only) are set forth in Article IV, Section 6, Paragraph J.
