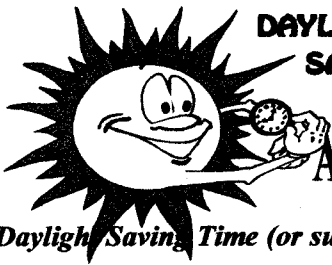

ABOUT THE NEW DAYLIGHT SAVINGS TIME SCHEDULE

Daylight Saving Time (or summertime as it is called in many countries) is a way of getting more light out of the day by advancing clocks by one hour during the summer. During Daylight Savings Time, the sun appears to rise one hour later in the morning when people are usually sleeping and sets one hour later in the evening, seeming to stretch the day longer. The reason DST works is because it saves energy due to less artificial light needed during the evening hours - clocks are set one hour ahead during the spring and one hour back to standard time in the autumn. Many countries observe DST, and many do not.

NOTE: Between March - April through September - November, it is summer in the northern hemisphere, where those countries may observe DST, while in the southern hemisphere it is winter. During the rest of the year, the opposite is true; it is winter in the northern hemisphere and summer in the southern.

Benjamin Franklin first suggested Daylight Saving Time in 1784, but was not until World War I, in 1916, when it was adopted by several countries in Europe that initially had rejected the idea.

It is difficult to predict what will happen with Daylight Savings Time in the future. Many countries change the date and the desire to change the time due to special events or conditions. The United States, Canada and some other countries decided to extend DST in 2007. The new start date is the second Sunday in March (previously the first Sunday in April) through the first Sunday in November (previously the last Sunday in October).

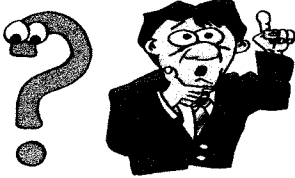

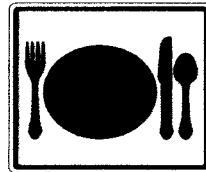
BRAIN TEASER

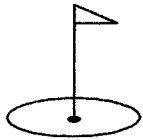
MEALS

February 4, 2008

Superintendent Dale Moles introduced Kenny Virgin as his new Assistant Superintendent. They have been repairing machines during the winter months. We will have the same chemical program as last year with a few additions - chemicals were ordered early in order to save money. The chemical program will be started around March 23/24. Some trees have been removed from the course in order to give air to the course. A long discussion was held regarding golf course play when the greens are frozen. 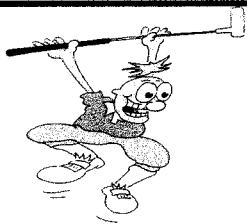

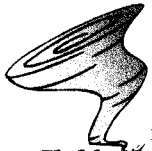
A discussion was held regarding pond drainage and excess standing water.

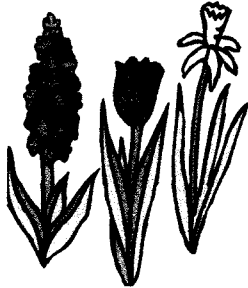

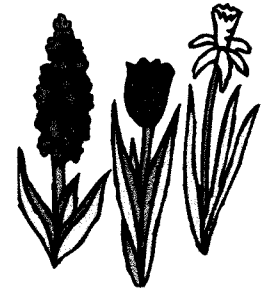

THE LINN VALLEY VOLUNTEER FIREMEN

TALK WITH KIDS / PARENTS

The Linn Valley Fire Department provided a program at the Linn Valley Community Church on February 27th for the children and their parents. Assistant Chief Todd Stone headed up a great evening of fun and information for everyone in attendance. He was assisted by Capt. Ron Walsner and Firefighter Josh Lee. Chief Stan Giles, who was recovering from a recent surgery, was in attendance, also.

The fire department began the evening by bringing in one of their fire trucks and inviting the children to explore the truck from top (literally) to the bottom. They had a lot of fun turning on the running lights, honking the horn, pretending to be the 'driver' and climbing all over the truck. The firemen were on hand to answer questions and explain all the "gadgets".

Assistant Chief Stone presented several videos on fire and family safety. One of the videos was an interactive one and the children responded with a lot of enthusiasm. Severe weather safety was another topic discussed. The procedure to follow if there was a severe weather warning while the children are at the church was explained. That procedure is that the parents are to stay alert to the conditions and if there is a weather warning, they are to come and get their children. Any children remaining at the church, if the parent couldn't get there, would be taken to an interior room at the church by the teacher(s). Assistant Chief Stone, after having checked all the church facilities, showed the children which room would be the most secure.

Capt. Ron Walsner then gave a demonstration of the fireman equipment. As he put on each piece of gear and equipment, he explained how it was designed for protection and how it was used. By the time he was fully equipped, the weight of the equipment totaled about 50 pounds. Special emphasis was put on the mask that the fireman would wear when entering a burning building. He explained never to be afraid if they would be in a fire and see a fireman with this mask. They are to be sure and go directly to him for safety and escape.

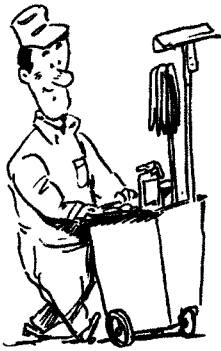
The kids had great questions and thanked the fireman for their time. As the children were dismissed, the fire department provided them with several 'handouts' and fun gifts. All of this was followed by refreshments provided by the LVCC kitchen crew, Kathy Beeson & Marilyn Campbell.

We in Linn Valley should be very proud of the quality of personnel we have and the dedication they have to their job in our VOLUNTEER Fire Department. Assistant Chief Stone is a certified level one EMT. We have several fire fighters that are in an intense 6 week training period right now.

A very similar program is being planned for the last Wednesday in March with the LV Police Department and the Animal Control Officer. It is important that our children recognize these officers and know that they can go to them for help at any time. Keeping our Linn Valley children safe is a number one priority of the Fire Department, Police Department and Animal Control. The more information our children have, the safer they will be.

These programs are open to anyone who would like to attend.
